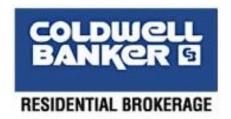

The median single family home price in KENILWORTH this week is \$1,990,000. The 59 homes have been on the market for an average of 237 days.

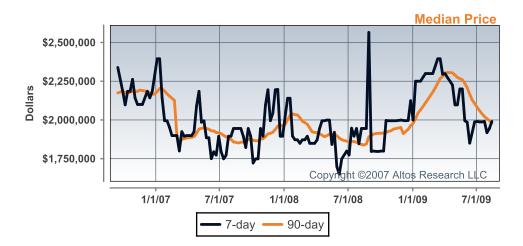
Inventory has been tightening but days-on-market and the Market Action Index have been basically unchanged, not providing strong indication for market conditions.

QUARTILES

To get a tightly targeted understanding of homes in the market, we break each locale into quartiles. Each quartile is 25% of the homes listed.

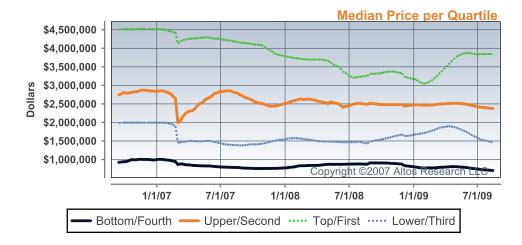
Most expensive 25% of homes
Upper-middle 25% of homes
Lower-middle 25% of homes
Least expensive 25% of homes

We'll refer to the quartiles in the trend graphs below.



PRICE

Despite this week's up tic, the market seems to have paused around this plateau. The Market Action Index is a good leading indicator for the durability of this shift.



QUARTILE PRICES

Often, we find insights by watching pricing trends within the quartile segments.

Pricing is on a slightly negative trend lately. Prices in Quartile 4 and 1 have been mixed recently, while the rest of the market is trending downward. Look to a strong, persistent up shift in the Market Action Index as a leading indicator of the trough in the market.



PRICE AND VALUE

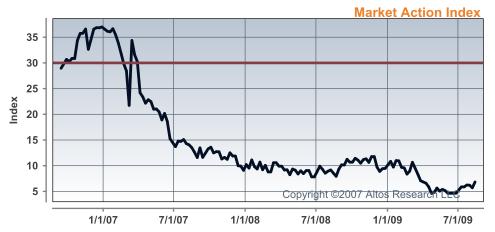
The market's downward trends are shared across both price and value. People are recently placing less value on homes (you can see the recent declines in price per square foot as evidence.) Look for significant changes in the Market Action Index as a precursor to price and value changes, possibly as inflection points for good investment opportunities.



INVENTORY

Inventory has been falling in recent weeks. Note that declining inventory alone does not signal a strengthening market. Look to the Market Action Index and Days on Market trends to gauge whether buyer interest is changing with the available supply.

Residential house prices are a function of supply and demand, and market conditions can be characterized by analyzing those factors. Watch this index for sustained changes: if the index falls into the Buyer's Market zone for a long period, prices are likely in for a downward correction.



The Market Action Index (MAI) illustrates the balance between supply and demand using a statistical function of the current rate of sale versus current inventory.

An MAI value greater than 30 typically indicates a "Seller's Market" (a.k.a. "Hot Market") because demand is high enough to quickly gobble up available supply. A hot market will typically cause prices to rise. MAI values below 30 indicate a "Buyer's Market" (a.k.a. "Cold Market") where the inventory of already-listed homes is sufficient to last several months at the current rate of sales. A cold market will typically cause prices to fall.



The quartiles can help you answer the question, "How hot is the market for homes in my price range?"

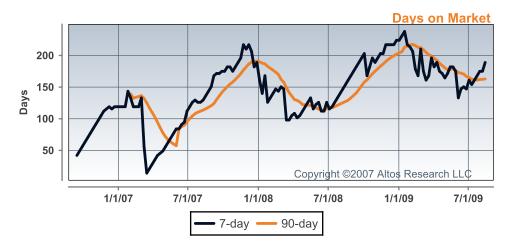
MARKET ACTION INDEX

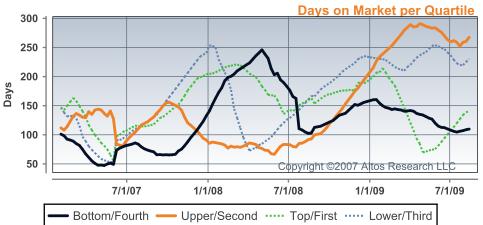
The KENILWORTH market is currently quite strongly in the Buyer's Market zone (below 30). The 90-day Market Action Index stands at 6. With several months of inventory available at the current sales rate, buyers should find ample choice.

The market has settled in at a relative stasis in inventory and sales conditions. It's a Buyer's market that has seen prices trend lower. Expect that consistent up trends in demand will be required before price trends change significantly.

MARKET ACTION

Not surprisingly given the overall Market Action Index, all quartiles are in the Buyer's Market zone with several months of inventory given the current rate of demand for homes in the quartile. Watch the quartile for changes before the overall market shifts. Often one end of the market (e.g. the low end) will improve and signal a strengthening market before the whole group changes.





DAYS ON MARKET (DOM)

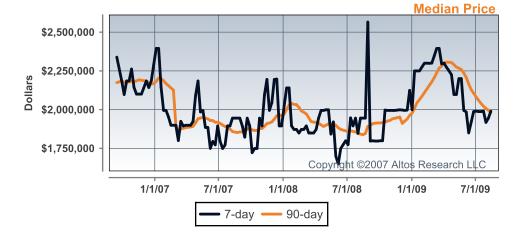
The properties have been on the market for an average of 237 days. Half of the listings have come newly on the market in the past 189 or so days.

DOM PER QUARTILE

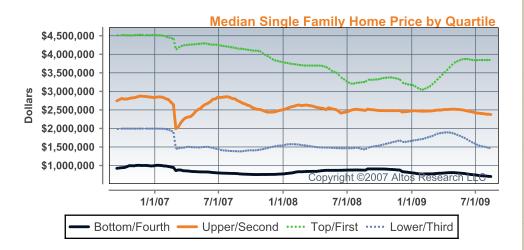
THIS WEEK

PRICE

We continue to see prices in this zip code hovering around these current levels, even though they bumped up a bit this week. Look for a persistent up-shift in the Market Action Index before we see prices move significantly from here.



PRICE PER QUARTILE

In the quartile market segments, we see prices across the quartiles of this zip code not tightly correlated recently. Prices in Quartile 1 and 4 have been mixed recently, while the rest of the market is trending downward. Look to a strong, persistent up shift in the Market Action Index as a leading indicator of the trough in the market.

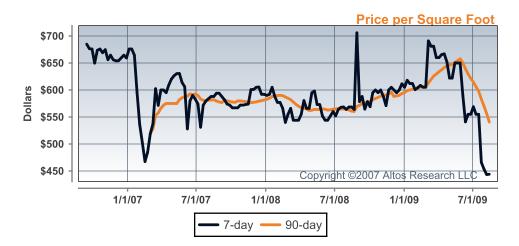

PRICE AND VALUE

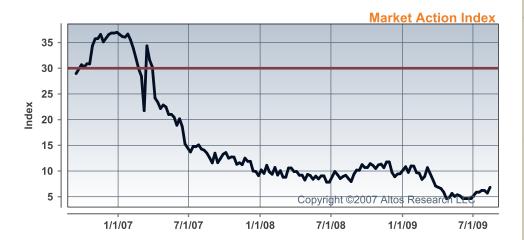
While prices have been basically flat, the price per square foot has been heading downward. While not a sign of broad strength in a market, larger homes are coming more available and buyers are tending to get more home for their money.

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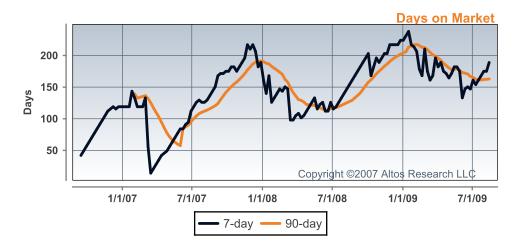

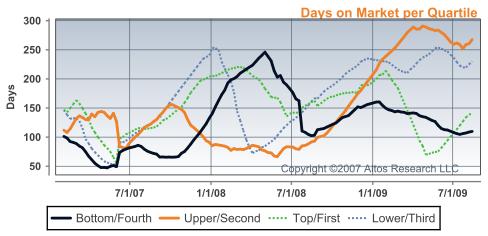
